







## Senior taking care of two grandsons gifted new porch steps

HARRIETTA — Like many seniors on a fixed income, 65-year-old Laurel Belstra knows there are things around the house that should be fixed but figuring out how to fix them can be a challenge.

One of those things was the steps leading up to her porch. After about 12 living in the home and using the steps, this year they finally gave out as Belstra walked over them. She would have fallen through if she hadn't grabbed the rail.

After they broke, Belstra said she set up a couple of cement blocks with boards over them as a substitute; as winter approached, however, she realized this couldn't be a permanent setup.

"I was nervous about having



those for the winter," said Belstra, who has been dealing with mobility issues as a result of hip surgery in the summer.

"I was using a walker but I'm using a cane now," Belstra said

On top of everything, Belstra is the legal guardian of two grandsons, ages 7 and 9.

Belstra adores her grandchildren but admits that keeping up with them is tough, especially at her age.

"Everybody says they keep you young," Belstra said. "I don't know about that."

Not having a working set of stairs not only presented dangers to her as she entered and exited her home, but to her grandsons as well.

Belstra's daughter, Kami Mongar, nominated her for a wish in the Cadillac News Believe ... Christmas Wishes Do Come True campaign.

"Even while navigating her own challenges, including hip surgery this past summer, she has remained a steady source of support to those around her, always offering a helping hand when she can," Mongar said.

"She's an incredibly caring person who never asks for anything for herself. Knowing her stairs are a safety risk has been a constant worry for me. New steps would bring peace of mind and make a huge difference for her."

Amy Gibbs, executive director of Cadillac Area Habitat for Humanity, said the story of a grandmother living on her own and caring for two grandsons was something that resonated with her and the rest of

"It's something we wanted to do," Gibbs said in regard to replacing the steps, "to make it safe for both her and her grandkids."

campaign existed, so to find out her daughter's wish for her had been granted was a


shock.
